The PEARL project is an exciting new public health intervention, implemented with the Ministry of Health and Medical Services, to find a pathway to tuberculosis (TB) and leprosy elimination in South Tarawa. This implementation study aims to demonstrate the feasibility and to evaluate the effect of population-wide TB and leprosy screening, treatment and prevention.

Join us in this historic study to prevent and cure TB and leprosy in South Tarawa.
